

Application Approval: Upon approval, you will go on the Scholarship Application List. Your place on the list is determined by the date we receive your completed application. We will notify you when you there is an opening in the program in the appropriate level of care. People on the Scholarship Application List are also eligible for charity home care in their own home off campus from Osborn Home Care if needed.

When an Opening is Available: If it has been more than six (6) months since you first applied, we will ask you to update your medical and financial application. Scholarship residents are required to spend their own funds including all assets until they can no longer afford to pay for their stay. They may not leave any funds in their estate nor give them away. Upon admission to the program, however, you will be asked for a list of items which may be of sentimental value that you would prefer to exclude from your assets so they can go to a friend or family member. This list of exclusions is subject to approval by the CFO. Scholarship residents are asked to close all credit cards, bank and investment accounts, and cannot have a car. The Osborn cannot assume any liabilities.

Osborn Home Care: In addition to the on-campus Scholarship program, Osborn Home Care provides services to people in their own homes in Westchester who are of limited means but not eligible for Medicaid.

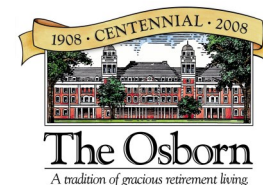

A Charitable Vision

Charity is the foundation of The Osborn. Miriam Osborn's vision was to build a gracious home where residents could live in retirement *whether they could afford to pay for their stay or not*. The Osborn was funded by her bequest and the philanthropy of her attorney, John W. Sterling. As a result of their charitable contributions and John Sterling's commitment to make this institution the finest of its kind, Mrs. Osborn's vision became a reality.

Throughout a century of caring for elders, Mrs. Osborn's charitable vision continues to be at the heart of the mission of The Osborn.

Today: The Osborn Scholarship Program

Residents who move to The Osborn with little or no ability to pay for their stay, or those who outlive their resources due to illness or advanced age, live in Independent and Assisted Living rental apartments or The H.O.P.E. Center for Memory Care. The program also provides home care to people who do not live at The Osborn and are unable to afford it.

The Scholarship Program

The program provides an apartment, three meals a day, scheduled transportation, a monthly stipend and an additional allocation for personal expenses. Furniture, household goods or other items will be provided by The Osborn as needed. The resident becomes a full member of the community, entitled to participate in all activities, use the amenities, and receive services.

The Osborn's Medical Director, Dr. William Martimucci, will be your physician. He is a Board certified gerontologist and member of WESTMED's Board of Directors. Medicare covers most health care and pharmacy needs. The Osborn will enroll you and pay for supplemental insurance.

Scholarship residents can move in directly to Independent or Assisted Living or The H.O.P.E. Center as appropriate when there is an opening in the program. Should the need for skilled nursing arise later, they can move to the Pavilion skilled nursing facility; however, there is no direct admission to skilled nursing.

Applying to the Scholarship Program

The Osborn respects the privacy of all its residents and prospective resident. All personal data and the identity of scholarship applicants and residents is kept strictly confidential. The application has two parts:

- Medical: A form to be completed by your physician based on a physical examination completed in the past six (6) months, and
- Financial Disclosure to be completed with substantiating documentation, including:
 - tax returns for the past five (5) years with all back schedules and forms;
 - recent statements on all investments, bank accounts, pension, Social Security, alimony, real estate taxes, insurance, repayment of loans due to you and debts. The Osborn cannot assume responsibility for any debts.
 - letter from a licensed realtor attesting to the value of any real estate.

Application Review: Your completed medical and financial forms will be reviewed by a registered nurse and the Chief Financial Officer, respectively. Our R.N. will meet with you to get to know you and review your medical status to determine which level of care at The Osborn would be most appropriate for you. The CFO will evaluate if your resources meet the guidelines for admission.
